

Pupil Premium

Schools are allocated money for Looked After Children, children of parents who are employed in the Armed Forces and children whose parents have identified that they are eligible for free school meals. This money is used to benefit the children's learning.

Pupil premium funding has been allocated to the school since 2011 and was initially focused on children taking up free school meals.

Funding levels

From April 2012, Pupil premium funding was changed and allocated to schools for any pupil who had been eligible for free school meals in any of the previous six years. Pupil premium funding was also allocated to 'Looked After' children. From April 2014 the unit value for the Pupil Premium was increased to £1300 per pupil. For 2016-2017 the amount is now £1320.
